

2025 Deary - Pony Club Camp June 29th to July 2nd, 2025

Who & What:

The Pony Club Camp at the Hatley Ranch Pony Club Grounds just outside Deary, Idaho began in 1967, and is still running strong. Camp is open to any Pony Club member (Unrated (UR) through A). **Campers must be 8 years of age***. Camp is considered a learning experience. It is a great opportunity to prepare for your next certification (rating) as there will be opportunities to work on Horse Management with feedback from instructors. Special topics will be presented depending on the general need of participants. Mounted lessons will be arranged based on camper numbers and level of riding skill as determined by the instructors. 2025 Instructors: Heidi Rebic, Ashley Nolting & Liz Tukey.

Duration of camp:

Camp officially starts with **check-in between 3-5pm Sunday, June 29th**. Sunday dinner provided (Taco Bar) and an informational meeting, at **6pm**, so please plan on getting your horse settled in before the meeting. Camp activity planned for Sunday evening. Dessert / S'mores each night prior to campfire and camp announcements. Mounted lessons will begin on Monday, June 30th. Camp ends Wednesday, July 2nd.

General Camp Info & Chaperones:

Campers get mounted and unmounted lessons, stabling (for one horse – additional horses must pay for stabling), & T-shirt. At this time, we are NOT planning on providing camp meals (except Sunday night). Please plan to bring your food, and we will update the website if food circumstances. Riders will participate in riding lessons on Monday, Tuesday, & Wednesday. Some lessons may be private, but majority will be group lessons, depending on numbers. There will be unmounted lessons throughout camp, as well as campfire and skits! **Each camper must have a chaperone on site at all times. Campers will receive additional information upon receipt of their registration if necessary.** Upon arrival, you will be greeted and directed to your assigned stall. You may find a camping place near it. Once settled, please check in with the secretary.

2025 Camp Options:

Continuing the popular format, we offer three camp options for mounted lessons:

Option Red	Option White	Option Blue
Option Red will be the “traditional” camp offering. Five mounted lessons, likely consisting of 2 flat, and 3 jump lessons. Private, semi-private, and group lessons will be utilized based on participants level and interest.	Option White will be for participants not interested in jumping, and therefore will consist of flat lessons, in which at least one will include poles/cavaletti which is a great cross-training method. This option may include a trail ride as one of the lessons. English OR Western saddles!	Option Blue will be used for riders and/or horses who may not be interested in quite so many concentrated lessons at camp. There will be 3 “traditional” lessons (flat & jumping), and the other 2 rides will be a trail ride or similar.

2025 Camp Shirts

Commemorative ‘Deary’ shirts are offered. T-shirts are **included** for the participants, and additional t-shirts (\$20), sweatshirts (\$30), and hooded sweatshirts (\$40) may be purchased. Shirt sizes available to order: Youth Medium (YM), Adult Small (AS), Adult Medium (AM), Adult Large (AL), and Adult Extra Large (AXL).

Directions	From Moscow: Go East on Highway 8, pass through Troy, and keep traveling east through Deary. Shortly after mile marker #29, turn left into a small dirt driveway, "Pony Club Road." Look for signs. Physical address: 5420 Highway 8, Deary, Idaho 83823.
Terrain & Camping & other	Wooded, rolling hills. Camping on grounds, no hook-ups. Hotels available in Moscow, ID (25 miles) Camping fee is included with entry fee. NO VAPING, SMOKING OR MARIJUANA use on the grounds. Motorized vehicles only driven by licensed drivers, and not allowed on XC course or some signed areas.
Stabling:	12x12 panel pole stalls (not covered). Bring your own shavings (no straw allowed) Stalls must be clean & stripped at the end of use. Please make note on entry of extra horses coming to camp.
Telephone:	Cell phone service is usually accessible on the top of the hill ☺ and in the town of Deary. The Deary camp phone number is 208-877-1381, however; you must use a calling card to call out.
Entries & Waivers:	Entry <u>must</u> be complete for stalls to be assigned and for you to ride. All persons planning to ride a horse on grounds <u>must</u> submit signed waivers. <u>Non-PC</u> -- the non-member waiver must be signed; this includes children and those not competing ("extra" horses will have stabling fees & must sign non-member waiver). Any outstanding accounts need to be settled before your entry will be accepted. You will be notified upon receipt of an entry.
Late Entries & Cancellations:	<u>We will not accept late entries!</u> We move to Deary early and cannot accept entries past the closing date of June 7 th . All cancellation refund requests will adhere to the Cancellation Policy below.
Horse Papers: Coggins Test, Brand Inspections & Health Certificates	An interstate certificate of veterinary inspection (Health Certificate) is required for travel between Idaho, Oregon & Washington, as well as current EIA (Coggins). Brand Inspections are HIGHLY recommended. <u>Please upload copy of vaccine records for Equine Influenza (Flu) and Equine Herpes (Rhino) within 6 months in online entry.</u>
Refunds/Cancellation Policy	Before the closing date, less \$10 (office fee). After closing date, less \$25, and only upon receipt of veterinarian or medical doctor's note.

THE UNITED STATES PONY CLUBS, INC.
RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER OF LIABILITY, AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT
FOR USPC NON-MEMBERS

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE for myself, and/or my child, my/our administrators and assigns, in consideration for my, and/or my child's, participation in this United States Pony Clubs, Inc. (USPC) activity to the following:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in an USPC activity, as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, spectator, volunteer, and/or trainer. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and USPC activities involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including, but not limited to, broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering or death ("Harm"). I fully understand that this release covers, but is not limited to, inherent risks of an equine activity which mean a danger or condition that is an integral part of an equine activity, including but not limited to, any of the following:

- The propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine;
- The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals;
- Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions;
- A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object;
- The potential of an individual during an equine activity to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant.

I Acknowledge that it is my/parent/legal guardian responsibility to ensure that I am/my child is wearing a completed wristband or armband card at this USPC activity. I authorize USPC, its successors or assigns, officials, officers, directors, employees, agents and/or volunteers to obtain and release to any USPC activity personnel (including, but not limited to, organizers, instructors, test examiners, chaperones), and to any first aid and safety personnel, medical professional, and treating medical facility, any information regarding my/my child's medical history, symptoms, treatment, exam results and/or diagnosis contained in the wristband or armband card. Furthermore, I agree and understand that it is my/parental/legal guardian responsibility to ensure that I/my child will not participate in any USPC mounted activities if I/my child have/has had a head injury or other medical condition and have/has been restricted from activity, until such time as the injury or condition is resolved and any activity restriction is lifted.

I AGREE to release the USPC, its successors or assigns, officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations from all claims including, but not limited to, claims for money or property, disability, covenants, actions, suits, causes or action, obligations, debts, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, judgments, orders and liabilities of whatsoever kind or nature in law, equity or otherwise, whether now known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and whether concealed or hidden, including but not limited to any state or federal statutory or common law claim or remedy of any kind whatsoever arising out of or in any way connected with any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the USPC or the USPC activity.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the USPC or the USPC activity, and specifically agree to the applicable state statute/law regarding equine/farm animal activity liability and signed posting (if any), in any state in which I or my child participates in a USPC activity. While a list of state statutes and select portions of those statutes believed to be in effect at the time of the execution of this agreement is attached hereto, I AGREE to locate, review and understand the full applicable statute in place in my jurisdiction.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the USPC and the USPC activity and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse in the USPC activity.

I AGREE that neither I, nor any one claiming through me, will hereafter bring, commence, prosecute or maintain, or cause or permit to be brought, commenced, prosecuted or maintained, any suit or action, either at law or in equity, in any court in the United States or in any state thereof, or elsewhere, against the USPC, its successors or assigns, for, on account of, arising out of, or in any way connected with any Harm to me or my horse, and that neither I, nor any one claiming through me, will enforce, prosecute, or recover upon, or attempt to enforce, prosecute, or recover upon, any claim or right of action whatsoever, which I, or any one claiming through me, may now have or hereafter assert, in any way connected with claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harms caused by me or my horse at the USPC activity.

I AGREE this Agreement is the entire agreement of the parties, and supersedes all prior oral and written understandings and agreements. This Agreement may be modified only by a written amendment signed by both parties.

I AGREE that if any provision of the Agreement is found to be invalid or illegal by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall be construed as if the affected provision had not been included in order to effectuate the intent of the parties.

In the event this form is signed by the parent/guardian of a minor, then all representations and acknowledgements herein are expressly made by, for, and on behalf of the parent/guardian and minor.

By signing below, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable USPC rules and all terms and provisions of the USPC activity. I acknowledge that I enter into this release after having read the same, and place my signature hereto of my own free voluntary act and deed. By signing below, I represent to the USPC that I fully understand its contents that I do not need any further explanation, and I waive any further explanation.

I have read and AGREE to abide by the above. REQUIRED — all signatures must be originals, not photocopies.
